Who: All experienced Scoutmasters, and Assistant Scoutmasters, Team Coaches and Crew Advisors. This will be a test only course, complete 80% of all tasks accurately and get credit for the full course.

Scoutmaster's, Coaches, & Advisor's must be "fully trained" in their position or the unit may not recharter for 2012. Fully trained includes: This is Scouting, Youth Protection, Specific Training and Intro to Outdoor Leader Skills. Crew Advisors need Intro to Outdoor Leader Skills if they are an outdoor crew.

Cost: \$10.00 per person

Bring: Rope – 8ft length, Pocketknife, Compass, Topo Map (local Glendora area is good but any one will be ok), personal first aid kit, tent, backpack or bag packed for an overnight outing, "10 essentials", pen/pencil and a sack lunch.
