Cub Scout Leadership Training Course Sequence

Step 1: Cub Fast Start

As the first step in the training continuum, Fast Start Training is meant to provide all the information and resources for new leaders to conduct their first meeting, along with guidance for the meetings that follow. There is a Fast Start for Tiger, Den and Webelos Den Leaders, Cubmaster and Pack Committee.

Step 2: This is Scouting

This is Scouting replaces New Leader Essentials. It offers an overview of scouting and is composed of six different modules.

Step 3: Youth Protection Training

Because of the great concern the Boy Scouts of America has concerning child abuse in our society, Youth Protection Training has been developed to safeguard both youth and adult members in the scouting program. Youth Protection MUST be renewed every two years.

Step 4: Cub Scout Leader Specific

Specialized knowledge for each leadership role. *On completion of this step, the trained patch has been earned.*

Additional Training:

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation BALOO

A one-day training event that introduces the skills needed to plan and conduct pack outdoor activities.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills for Webelos Training

Designed specifically for Webelos den leaders and their assistants, this course teaches outdoor-related skills through demonstration and hands-on practice. This is an overnight course that is required for Webelos den camping without the rest of the pack.

Boy Scout Leadership Training Course Sequence

Step 1: Boy Scout Fast Start

As the first step in the training continuum, Fast Start Training is meant to provide all the information and resources for new leaders to conduct their first meeting, along with guidance for the meetings that follow.

Step 2: This is Scouting

This is Scouting replaces New Leader Essentials. It offers an overview of scouting and is composed of six different modules.

Step 3: Youth Protection Training

Because of the great concern the Boy Scouts of America has concerning child abuse in our society, Youth Protection Training has been developed to safeguard both youth and adult members in the scouting program. Youth Protection MUST be renewed every two years.

Step 4: Scoutmaster/ASM Specific

Specialized knowledge for Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters in basic troop operations.

Step 5: Outdoor Leader Skills

Required outdoor training for Scoutmasters and ASMs. The skills required for the Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks. *On completion of this step, Scoutmasters and ASMs may wear the trained patch.*

Troop Committee Training Course Sequence

Follow Steps 1, 2, and 3 under Boy Scout sequence.

Step 4: Troop Committee Challenge

A course that discusses each role in the committee and how they work together to support the youth. *After completion of this step, they may wear the trained patch*

Varsity Leadership Training Course Sequence

Step 1: Fast Start Training

As the first step in the training continuum, Fast Start Training is meant to provide all the information and resources for new leaders to conduct their first meeting, along with guidance for the meetings that follow.

Step 2: This is Scouting

This is Scouting replaces New Leader Essentials. It offers an overview of scouting and is composed of six different modules.

Step 3: Youth Protection Training

Because of the great concern the Boy Scouts of America has concerning child abuse in our society, Youth Protection Training has been developed to safeguard both youth and adult members in the scouting program. Youth Protection MUST be renewed every two years.

Step 4: Varsity Leader Specific

This is a three-part training program for training adult Varsity Scout leaders. All three parts are usually given on the same day.

Step 5: Outdoor Leader Skills

Required outdoor training for Varsity Leaders. The skills required for the Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks. *On completion of this step, Varsity Coaches and Assistant Coaches may wear the trained patch.*

Venturer Leadership Training Course Sequence

Step 1: Venture Fast Start Training

Planning process to get a crew up and running and off to a successful start. Highlights include program goals, Venturing methods, crew orientation, steps to getting your crew up and running, leadership position responsibilities, and hints for successful crew operations. It also provides information on suggested crew activities, cooperative and problem-solving games, and suggested agendas.

Step 2: This is Scouting

This is Scouting replaces New Leader Essentials. It offers an overview of scouting and is composed of six different modules.

Step 3: Venturing Youth Protection Training

The Venturing Youth Protection Training has been developed to safeguard both youth and adult members and also includes guidelines for the co-ed nature of venturing. Youth Protection MUST be renewed every two years.

Step 4: Venturing Leader Specific

This training introduces the new adult crew leader to Venturing by providing basic information needed to successfully operate a crew. This information includes the purpose and mission of Venturing, characteristics of Venturer-aged youth, organization and leadership of the crew, and program planning and officer training. On completion of this step, Advisors and Assistant Advisors may wear the trained patch.
